28th Annual Event Set for July 9–12 in Okemah, Oklahoma

Okemah, OK [Wednesday, April 23, 2025]— Now in its 28th year, the Woody Guthrie Folk Festival has become a cornerstone event in Oklahoma and a respected gathering for folk and Americana music fans from around the world. The Woody Guthrie Coalition, Inc. is pleased to announce that this year's festival will take place July 9–12, 2025, in Woody Guthrie's hometown of Okemah, Oklahoma.

The 2025 festival will open with **An Evening with Hayes Carll and Evan Felker** on Wednesday, July 9. **Sarah Lee Guthrie**, granddaughter of Woody Guthrie, will perform an opening set.

Free family-friendly programming will continue with the return of the **Children's Festival** at **Okemah's City Park** on **Saturday**, **July 12**, offering a variety of free activities for kids of all ages.

Leading up to the main event, the **Women of WoodyFest Roadshow** will take place on **May 4 at The Blue Door in Oklahoma City**, highlighting female artists who reflect the values and mission of the festival.

 Thursday daytime shows at the Crystal Theatre and Bound for Glory Stage at the Hen House are free and open to the public.

- A wristband is required for Friday and Saturday daytime performances at both venues for attendees aged 17 and up.
- Evening performances at the Pastures of Plenty also require a wristband for those 17 and older.
- Attendees 16 and under are admitted free of charge at all venues with an accompanying adult.
- A **3-day festival pass** (valid July 10–12) will be available at a **discount of up to \$50** during the early bird sales window from **May 1–31**.
